

Mark A. Wagenbrenner of Wagenbrenner Realty and a partner are currently in contract to purchase the abandoned AC Humko manufacturing site. Not too many details of the purchase are known, however, the site is apparently being purchased with few or no contingencies.

The HWS officers have already had one meeting with Mr. Wagenbrenner, his attorney (Ron Plank), and his architect (Rob Morris) in which the officers presented the previously-established HWS "wish list" for the site, such as park land along the river, a continuation of our neighborhood's street grid, and owner-occupied housing that fits the rest of Harrison West. The Buyer is now working on a site plan to present in the near future. Stay tuned as this significant development plays out over the next few months - hopefully, our neighborhood and the Buyer can work together to make the redevelopment of the AC Humko site a success for everyone and an integral part of Harrison West.




