

Constitutional Amendment Passed

The Constitutional amendment to redraw the boundaries of Harrison West passed by a unanimous vote at the June 18 meeting.

The amendment as accepted is as follows:

The area designated as Harrison West is bounded as follows: Beginning at the centerline intersection of Olentangy River Road and Fifth Avenue; Thence easterly along Fifth Avenue to Harrison Avenue; Thence southerly to Buttles Avenue; Thence continuing westerly along Buttles to Thurber Drive; Thence southerly along Thurber Drive to Goodale Boulevard; Thence westerly along Goodale Boulevard to Olentangy River Road; and Thence northerly along Olentangy River road to the intersection of Olentangy River Road and Fifth Avenue, the place of beginning.

Start and End Times

The Race starts about 3 PM and should finish about 7 PM. Street setup will begin in the morning, probably 8 or 9 AM, but the streets won't be closed down until close to 3 PM. We expect the races to run until 7 PM at the latest, with the race course open shortly after the last race's conclusion.



I'd be going "ho hum" right now, except for the flavors still dancing on my taste buds from lunch.

While perusing the menu, I decided everything sounded good: turbinado glazed salmon with scallion mashed potatoes and stirfried vegetables; lemon roast chicken with sauteed spinach, mashed potatoes and balsamic drizzle; cured pork tenderloin; roasted vegetable plate with risotto cake; and sesame chili marinated mahi mahi with sticky rice and broccolini.

They also offer designer pizzas with portabella mushrooms, andouille sausage, and jerk chicken.

Dave ordered the cashew chicken with udon noodles, stir-fried vegetables and sweet garlic sauce. Yum!

Sweet garlic sauce sounds as if you should ask for it on the side, but in this dish, it works -- big time. Just enough sweet and garlic to balance the crispy vegetables and fresh-tasting chicken chunks.

The udon noodles are firmer and rounder than egg noodles, and provide another texture foil to the crisp veggies and tender chicken. Just don't try to eat them with the chopsticks that arrive standing at attention in the bowl.

The dish is pretty, too, with all the colors from the veggies and herbs. All in all, a very positive and satisfying meal.

I ordered the lunch special fried chicken wrap with french fries. (If my doctor is reading this, I swear I left more than half the fries on the plate.)

When I ordered, I didn't hear the "fried" part of the wrap, so it was quite a surprise when I bit into the large wrap to find crispy bitesized pieces of fried panko-and herb-crusted chicken breast. Also stuffed into the overflowing wrap were lettuce, tomato, onion, cheddar cheese, and just enough ranch dressing to add more flavor and hold the whole thing together.

What elevates this wrap over the rest is the chicken -- those crispy, flavorful bites were so good, they made the chicken in other wraps seem bland and boring. This one is a hit with me.

Since it was a working lunch, neither Dave nor I ordered dessert -- not even for Harrison West could we indulge that far in the daytime.

However -- I will be going back for something called the triple chocolate tower with macadamia nut brownie and Graeter's double chocolate chunk ice cream.

If you like strawberry shortcake, take a friend along to enjoy the CBC version with house recipe shortbread, Johnson's triple vanilla bean ice cream and macerated strawberries.

They also offer an upsidedown banana cream pie with candied pecans; creme brulee; and a sorbet trio.





Eadie Gourmet Eats Out at **Columbus Brewing** Company

Dave Butler and I met up at Columbus Brewing Company for a working lunch, and I was impressed. Dave is a really hard worker! Seriously, I've been blowing off the CBC because I've never been impressed with the food at designer beer breweries. After the CBC and an earlier experience at the Elevator, I'm finding I must change my mind.

Dave ordered off the menu and I ordered the lunch special, and both were excellent -- even better than excellent.

When you add in that CBC makes it really fun to be there with nightly specials of drink and entertainment, one can understand why this out-of-the-way place is so popular. (Out of the way means it's on Short Street in the Brewery District. Go south on Front to the Worly Building and turn right on Liberty. It's at the end of the street.)

It's a Cameron Mitchell restaurant, which may explain some food pluses.

The menu includes the hot and sour calamari such as you find at Cap City -- lots better when you ask them to hold the hot and sour! There's a panko crab cake with asian slaw and cilantro aioli and a roasted chicken salad with corn. olives, dates, pine nuts, and goat cheese.
