HWS Opposes Liquor Permit for Ziggy's

On January 9, Harrison West Society representatives attended a hearing before the Ohio Liquor Commission concerning a carry-out beer and wine liquor permit for the new Ziggy's, which is taking over the former Flash Coffee Shop on Third Avenue. The HWS opposed the issuance of this new permit because of a concern over having too many liquor locations on Third Avenue, including Culpeppers which is a mere thirty feet away from Ziggy's on the other side of the Subway shop. Nothing is known yet of the Liquor Commission's decision in this matter.

The dim sum menu at Fortune Restaurant is extensive for Columbus. Try the steamed shrimp dumplings - delicate and translucent.

The gyoza at Restaurant Japan simply cannot be beat.

Otani's Friday night buffet is great value for diners who cannot get enough sushi. Last time I was there, the sushi included tuna, salmon, California roll, and squid.

Haiku still has the best noodle dishes.

For anything Chinese, Hunan Lion makes it best, including an incredibly-good garlic chicken and outstanding Mala string beans.

El Vaquero on Olentangy remains my favorite Mexican restaurant. Ask for the warm tomatillo sauce for the chips.

Tommy's Pizza on Lane Avenue in Upper Arlington makes my favorite thin-crust pizza.

If you haven't tried the "take and bake" pizza from Mama Mimi's at Gentile's Wine store in Grandview, you're missing the best made-at-your-home pizza anywhere.

Barcelona specials always can be counted on for outstanding and interesting tastes.

Turka Dal Punjabi is nothing more than spiced black lentils cooked in a clay oven, but they keep luring me back to Sher-E-Punjab.

When I want an artery-clogging burger, I usually head to Max and Erma's for a "garbage" burger and fries.

The seriously large chocolate cake from Cap City Diner remains my favorite chocolate cake ever.

Greater's raspberry chip ice cream is my favorite non-chocolate ice cream.

For chocolate ice cream, I head to Handels, where the chocoholic chunk chocolate is a chocolate lovers dream.

Eadie Gourmet Eats Out 2003 Favorites

I've been revisiting area restaurants to taste once again my favorite dishes. Here, in no real order, are my picks from 2003.

Elemental Restaurant does a wonderful panko-crusted walleye fillet -- even better than many "fish houses."

The best beef I had in 2003 was the beef tournedos from the Elevator Brew Haus. Elevator pan sears medallions of beef tenderloin and serves them with garlic mashed potatoes, grilled asparagus, Dopplebock demi-glaze, smoked bacon-red pepper relish and a marsala pan sauce. Simply outstanding.

At the Happy Greek, where I enjoy many foods, I love both the Melitzanosalata, which is roasted eggplant with fresh garlic, roasted red peppers, olive oil, walnuts, kalamata olives, and feta cheese and the fried squid. They never have disappointed me with the squid. It's always wonderful.

Indian Oven introduced me to coriander chutney made with green chilies, ginger, and garlic. One of the freshest tastes I had all year.

I decided the Basi Italia gnocchi all forno was Yin and Yang on a plate because of the delicate gnocchi contrasted with the earthy wild mushroom bechamel sauce.

I fell in love with the sauteed scallops and three-cheese risotto at Strada's.
