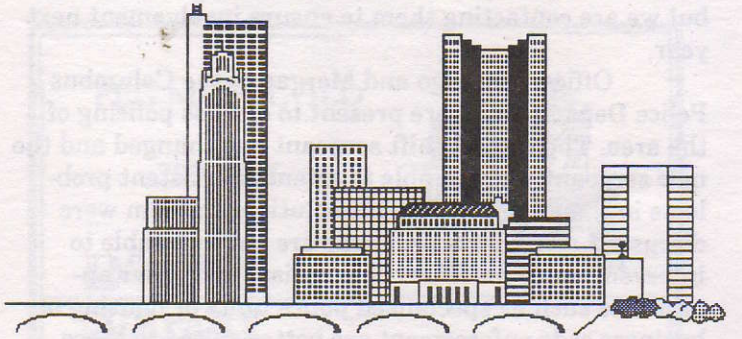

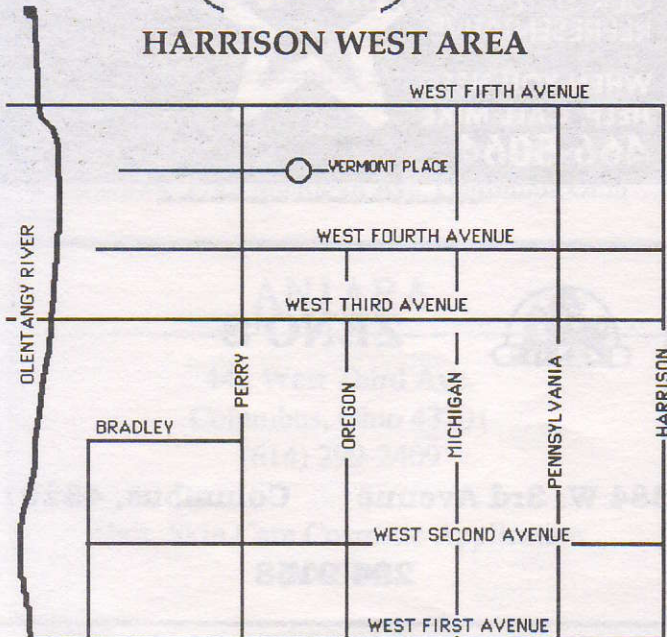

JUNE 13, 1991 MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm with the president, Glenn Cook, presiding.

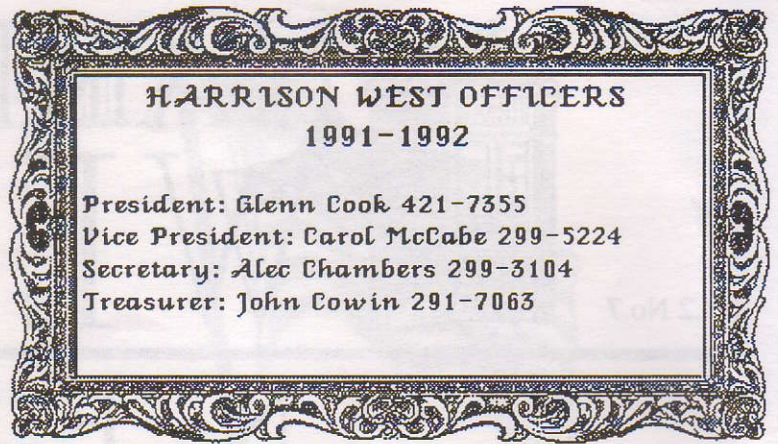
The minutes of the last meeting were approved as written in the Harrison West News.

The treasurer was not present to report. Bills of \$111.80 for printing of the newsletter and of \$17.00 for postage were presented and a motion to pay them was passed.

It was announced that Dean Smith of Ameriflora had been contacted to attend one of our meetings to answer questions we may have concerning Ameriflora. Information on reduced-rate long term tickets for the event was also given.

Projects for the improvement of Harrison West were discussed. The procedure for obtaining funds from Quest '92 presents a number of difficulties for the area. We will continue to look into obtaining funds from the program but it appears that we will be unable to meet the criteria to obtain them. Alternatives to this were discussed. One possibility was that of volunteers planting trees bought from the city with Harrison West funds. The planting of a flower bed at Third and Perry as previously discussed with the Martha Walker Garden Club was also mentioned. Attention was drawn to the Huntington Brush-up program for repainting of homes. It was too late to get involved in the program this year but we are contacting them to ensure involvement next year.

Officers Perrigo and Morgan of the Columbus Police Department were present to discuss policing of the area. The second shift sergeant has changed and the new sergeant was not able to attend. Persistent problems in the area and possible solutions to them were discussed. Long-term problems are not amenable to intervention by an officer in a cruiser and other approaches such as specialized police units or housing or business code enforcement are better suited to these problems. It was observed that a loitering law would simplify some order problems.

A suggestion to get the members of City Council more directly involved in the area was taken under consideration.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:00 pm.

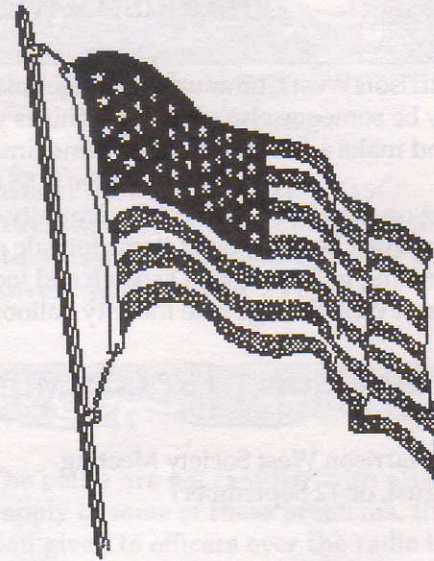

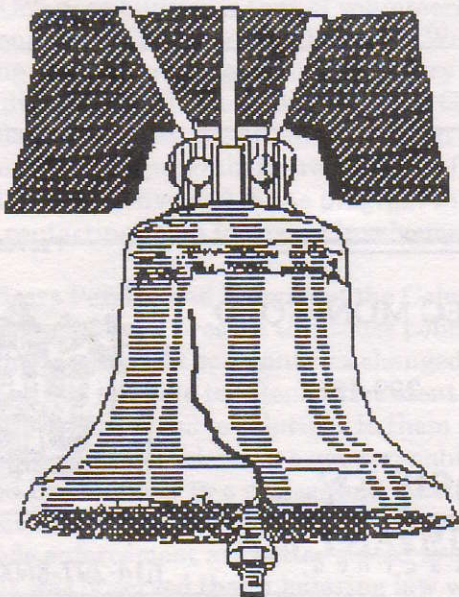
