



## Minutes of the Harrison West Society, September 12, 1991 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written in the Harrison West News.

John Cowin, treasurer, did not report a balance. A motion to pay a bill of \$111.80 to Insty Prints for printing of the Harrison West News was approved. Chris Hershberger handed over \$40.00 in checks from participants in the garage sale and was reimbursed by the Society.

Officer Ken Huck of the Columbus Police Department discussed the problems of non - violent misdemeanors. The city does not have a jail of its own and is dependent upon the county. Pressure on space is such that only certain violent offenders can be locked up immediately. Otherwise the offender is given a citation and a court date and released. Such problems were considered to be part of the cities growing pains. Encouraging the city to found a jail of its own and to re - examine legislation on juvenile crime and on parental responsibility were considered.

Officer Huck said that at the time of the fire at "The Avenue" a number of arrests were made for public order offences but that no arrests have been made of those directly involved with the fire. A list of suspects has been drawn up.

Chris Hershberger reported on progress in organizing the Garage sale. Over 25 houses, the Godman Guild, the Columbus Art League, and the First Brethren Church had signed up. Advertisements or short articles had been placed in local publications (The Villages this week, Victorian Village Vibe, Busybody etc.) and posters had been placed.

A plan to have a slate of external speakers at the monthly meetings to cover topics of general and immediate interest to the community was discussed and received favorably. For example, an officer from the Fire Department would be invited in November to discuss Christmas fire safety. In the future, other speakers such as our two largest businesses, Batelle and Capital City Products would be invited to let us know about their plans for the future. Speakers on social programs relevant to the area would also be invited.
