CLEAN COMMUNITY PROJECT SET FOR APRIL 25TH

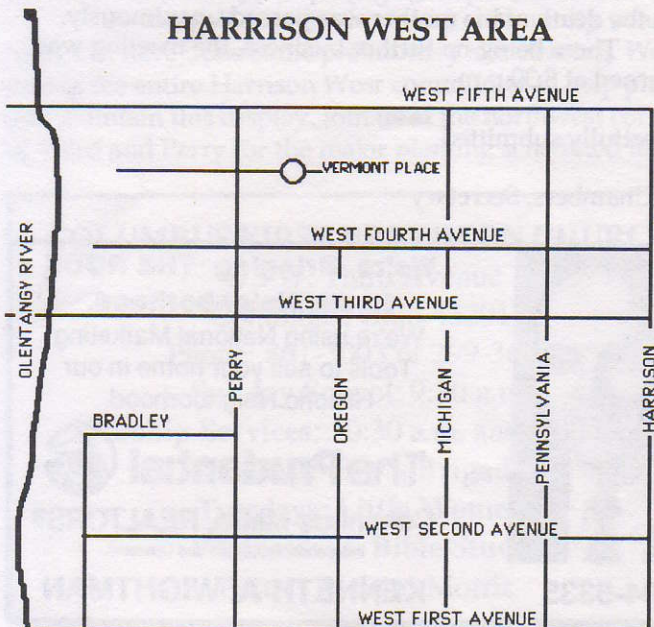

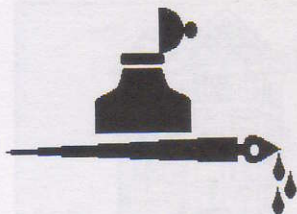

Minutes of the Harrison West Society, December 12, 1991 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. with Carol McCabe, presiding. The President was unable to attend due to the recent death

of his mother.

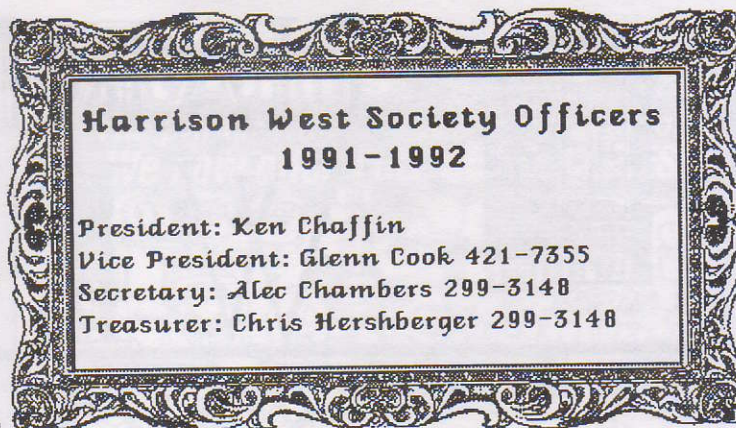
The minutes of the previous meeting were corrected as follows. Doctor's Hospital will be offering its facilities for services on Good Friday only, and not on Easter Sunday as previously reported. The figures reported by the Treasurer in his year end report were true figures and no further adjustments were necessary. With these corrections, the minutes of the last meeting were approved.

Candy Gill speaking on behalf of the nomination committee, the other members were Ken Chaffin and Chris Hershberger, presented the following slate of candidates for office: President, Ken Chaffin, Vice President, Glenn Cook, Treasurer, Chris Hershberger, Secretary, Alec Chambers.

No other nominations having been received from the floor when they had been called, a motion to accept these nominations was made by Pastor Richard Morris. This was seconded and approved by the meeting.

A call was made for volunteers to help with the Clean Community project. A volunteer slip will be placed in the Harrison West News. In particular, volunteers to act as block captains to identify problem sites in their area will be sought. This year we have had short notice of the event. The city has changed the way in which the campaign is being run with communities setting their own dates for cleaning the area in April. For Harrison West the most likely date is April 25th with April 11th less likely. First Brethren Church will act as the centre of the effort and cleaning materials and refreshments will be available there. A party after the effort is to be arranged.

Battelle has presented a plan for a triangular planting about 35 feet on a side of native American plants. The planting and maintenance will involve residents of Harrison West, the Martha Walker Garden Club, and Battelle grounds staff. The planting will be on the 16th of May with the 17th as a rain date. and the planting should require only occasional maintenance. Anyone interested in helping should contact Chris Hershberger at 299 - 3148. The Short North Garden Tour is upcoming. This will involve exhibiting private gardens in Victorian Village, Harrison West, and Dennison Place. Anyone interested in

Pastor Morris announced that the Hall family, a gospel group, will be at the First Brethren Church on April 5 at 6:00. The Good Friday services at Doctors Hospital will be held at 15 minute intervals from 11:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Jerome Heinz will be holding a service at the Palace that evening.

There was some discussion about problems in and around Michigan Avenue between Third and Fourth. The possibility of complaining to Sandefur Management Company and CMHA about problems in the area was discussed. Some interest was shown in the establishment of a Block Watch in the area. The president - elect Ken Chaffin urged us to consider these problems as affecting the community as a whole and to cooperate in solving them.

A motion expressing sympathy to Glenn Cook upon the death of his mother was passed unanimously.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m.
