Mary Funk made a motion to approve the minutes of the last meeting. Passed.

Treasurer's Report Tom Maxwell reported that the Treasury balance is \$5,275 and gave details on income and disbursements. Veda Gilp motioned to pay the regular expenses of publishing the newsletter. Passed.

Planning and Development: A.C. Humko President Dimoff reported that the property could be under contract soon, slated for high density residential contingent on rezoning.

Old Business and Committee Reports:

Membership Committee Chair Mark Hamsher reported 96 renewals or new members.

Yard Sale Sandy Woolard motioned for \$100 to pay expenses, passed.

Newsletter Editor Veda Gilp reported the deadline for news and advertising submissions is the third Friday of each month. Also asked for input from members for articles.

Public Art Committee Co-Chair Maddy Weisz reported that the city is to begin excavation for the sculptures soon. Still need \$2,000.

Traffic Committee Craig Copeland reported on the Traffic Calming Plan, which will place traffic calm-

ing on most Harrison West street corners. The system will enhance the quality of life in the neighborhood while discouraging cut-through traffic. It will include self-enforcing speed limits of 15 to 20 m.p.h., with 25 m.p.h. on third, Fifth, and Neil Avenues.

New Harrison West Park Name An informal vote of 10 to 5 was in favor of naming the park the Third Avenue Bridge Park.

27th Annual Victorian Village Home and Garden Tour to Coincide with Goodale Park Sesquicentennial Celebration September 16

This year's tour will be particularly noteworthy as the community recognizes the 150th Anniversary of the city's oldest public park. The celebration will include an antique car show, ice cream social, and Victorian music in the gazebo.

Tickets for the Home and Garden Tour are \$8 in advance an \$10 on tour day. This year's tour, "Urban Legends," celebrates the notion of city living combined with the unique century homes found throughout Victorian Village. Today, the Village stands as the grande dame of urban neighborhoods and shares the tale of central Columbus -- from growth and prosperity at the turn of the 20th century to decay and disrepair in the 1960s and 1970s, and finally renewal in the late 80s and resurgence at the beginning of the 21st century.

This year's homes are clustered around the Park on Buttles and Dennison, and on West Russell Street and Neil Avenue.



SIDE-by-SIDE Installation in Progress

After two-and-a-half years in the planning, the long-awaited installation of the SIDE-by-SIDE public art sculptures is about to become reality for Harrison West. Signs of life will be evident throughout September and early October at the newly named Third Avenue Bridge Park, where the sculptures will be installed. Holes for the foundations have already been dug, and both of the stainless steel sculpture pieces are being fabricated this week in Solon, Ohio.

Traffic Plans Look Good for Harrison West

Big news for Harrison West and other northside historic neighborhoods! The "Spring Sandusky Mitigation Report," prepared for the City by the national traffic engineering firm Glatting-Jackson, was highly critical of past City administrations: "The neighborhood streets are now in a state where years of inappropriate policy and neglect need to be corrected through a thorough and systematic policy shift and renovation over time."

The report reviews the "Memorandum of Agreement" (MOA) negotiated in 1999 under federal historic preservation law, then lays out the "mitigation package" that would satisfy the MOA. The HW Society is a consulting party to the MOA.

Here's what the traffic expert says Harrison West needs:

No more "Arterials"! He says the current "arterial" classifications, such as for Third and Fifth, should be changed soon in the City Thoroughfare Plan to allow these roads to be redesigned into safer, traffic-calmed, liveable streets.


No more trucks! He wrote that "Through truck routes are neither necessary nor desirable in the neighborhoods." Today, a through-truck route snakes through Harrison West. He wants the route to be moved outside the neighborhoods in the short-term. He also designed a special traffic calming device for Michigan at Buttles Avenue to help keep trucks from heading north into Harrison West, to be constructed by the end of the freeway construction in 2005, "and ideally sooner".

Real-world results! He wants to use traffic calming to self-enforce speed limits by renovating our street system,

the framework streets like Third and Fifth, and all other side streets. Michigan Avenue would be a non-framework street.

Entrance Features! As part of the "fair short term package," entryways would be built at Third at the bridge, Fifth just west of Perry, and Michigan just north of Goodale.

New side street intersections! Intersections will be rebuilt a bit higher



and with bulb-outs (see drawing). He says that by 2005 they should be renovated, including Fourth at Perry, Michigan, Pennsylvania and Harrison, and the same throughout southern Harrison West along Second and First.

Brick streets! Restore all of Harrison West's streets (except for Third and Fifth) to brick as part of the City's regular maintenance program, "over the next several decades", "starting in the short term."

Safe speed limits! Explaining why speed limits should be changed to 20 m.p.h. on the side streets (nonframework streets) and 25 to 30 on the framework streets, he writes "Speeds higher than that are dangerous to pedestrians, noisy, and not in keeping with the neighborhoods." All speed limits in Harrison West would be lowered soon.

A safer Third Avenue! There's no 2005 deadline here, but he provided a detailed design for Third to achieve a 25 to 30 mph design speed and said it "should be done as part of the City's transportation construction program starting now and extending over the next several decades." (Perhaps when the Third Avenue sewer main is worked on?) Fifth Avenue also will get its own design.

The next Traffic Task Force meeting will be September 12 at 5:30 at Westminster Thurber Auditorium at 717 Neil Avenue.


New Life United Methodist Church Celebrating Special Anniversary September 9, 10 AM







Good Looks or Chain Link? Only ODOT Knows





It's still up in the air what the Michigan Connector Bridge will look like once it's built in the next few years. Will it have ugly chain link "vandal fencing" (above left), as proposed by ODOT. Or will it be an ornamental wrought iron fence (above right), as proposed by the Design Task Force. The bridge will be located at the southern entrance to Harrison West, near the intersection of Michigan Avenue and Goodale Street. The design for the better fencing was created by the Task Force's Columbus design firm, who wrote that the fence meets ODOT safety requirements while exhibiting "traditional character and ability to blend with the vernacular architecture of the neighborhoods."


