Neighborhood Master Plan Is In the Works

A Neighborhood Master Plan is the blueprint for a neighborhood. It outlines the neighborhood's long-term goals in terms of street grids, housing stock, businesses, development, and amenities.

The Harrison West Society is working on the neighborhood's first ever Master Plan. This Plan will guide the neighborhood for years to come.

For instance, the Harrison West Society wants to open Buttles West to the river and the Society wants all streets and sidewalks in Harrison West to return to the neighborhood street grid.

Your input is needed. We'll discuss it at the March 17 meeting. This issue will affect the neighborhood for the next century. Be at the meeting to make your views known.



Affordable Housing Situation Discussion at March 17 Meeting

Big changes are on the horizon for the affordable housing in Harrison West. Nearly all of the affordable housing, which is subsidized through a government program known as "Section 8," is being purchased by the Ohio Capital Corporation for Housing (OCCH) and will be managed by Community Properties of Ohio Management Services (CPOMS).

Representatives from OCCH and CPOMS will be at our March 17th meeting to discuss this purchase and the exterior and interior renovations and improvements that will be made to the units. There will be an extended question and answer period following their presentation, so that Harrison Westers who have issues with the properties and the tenants will get answers.

Interior improvements will include new cabinets and fixtures, new paint, adding air conditioning, and replacing flooring and carpeting. Exterior improvements will include new doors and windows, renovations to porches, trim-work, exterior painting, fencing and landscaping.

Also, the representatives will discuss their vision for the management and security of the properties into the future. CPOMS has emphasized that it plans to manage the units much better than did the previous owner, Broad Street Management. Broad Street was indifferent to the property, its tenants, and the neighborhood concerns.

CPOMS's management of the units will include a social services program and perhaps an off-duty police officer security program. CPOM is also committed to enforcing leases and evicting tenants who do not fulfill their obligations under the lease.

Please be sure to come to the March meeting to discuss these important neighborhood issues with the OCCH and CPOMS representatives. This is a good opportunity to work toward making the affordable housing residents in Harrison West good neighbors.

It is time for us to determine what our neighborhood will look like in 10 years. With an Area


Commission, our neighborhood will have the power to stop bad development like the Phoenix Group's proposal for the Humko; and to encourage more good development, like what is now planned for Humko.




With an Area Commission, Harrison West will have the power to control its destiny and to protect the fabric of our neighborhood.

Eadie Gourmet Eats Out at A Taste of Bali

Brown sugar figures in many dishes at Taste of Bali. We were pretty sure we found it in the fried diced potatoes with Indonesian herbs.

Fish paste or fish base also appears in many dishes, including, we decided, the peanut-based salad dressing!

Bali does a nice string bean sauteed with garlic; it's still crisp and very garlicky.

Set 3 was the selection of hot dishes, including Egg Balado. This is a hen's egg hard boiled, then deep fried, then drenched with a tongue-searing chili sauce. Four of us did not finish even half an egg. It was weirdly un-tasty.

Rendang is sirloin cooked for hours in spicy coconut sauce. Think you wouldn't like coconut, meat, and spice in the same dish? Think again. It was wonderful.

So was the Ayam Bumbu Rujak, which begins with grilled

chicken which is then stewed in red coconut sauce. Very sweet, peanutty, and heavily coconut. It's #22 on the menu and would make a wonderful meal by itself.

We thought we had been daring with our choice of main dishes, but our courage got a real test with dessert.

For one thing, there was no chocolate! And the Dutch colonized Indonesia!

There was rice -- warm sweet black wild rice in coconut milk. It was chewy, creamy, and nutty, and so good, we left not a single grain.

Yam marbles in coconut milk are tougher to describe. Think sweet potato-flavored gummi bears in milk heavily sweetened with brown sugar.

The green mung bean gelatin teardrops in coconut milk is cool and lovely if you drink it with a straw, but bland and oddly textured if you eat it with a spoon. Go figure.



Eadie Gourmet Eats Out at A Taste of Bali

A Taste of Bali is going into my restaurant favorites collection. The food excellent and exotic, and Reza, our server, was determined to help us understand and enjoy the dishes of his country.

Friends Joy Reeve, Jean Godby, and Debbie Stollenwerk, and I decided to sample much of the menu by ordering the Rijsttafel, which is a sampler of several dishes as well as rice. The two "special sets" we ordered included mild and spicy meat, vegetables and various sauces. We liked most of what we found.

Because some of our group did not care to eat incendiary food, we ordered Set 1, which is not spicy, as well as Set 3, which contained items that caused us to breath fire.

In Set 1 was Ayam Kalasan, marinated chicken fried in brown sugar and herbs. It was way too dry, but had there still been some juice in the chicken leg and breast, it would have been delicious.

The Terik Daging, sirloin cooked for hours in sweet coconut sauce, also was too dry, but again the taste was excellent.

We decided the dryness was the result of overcooking, because other dishes were very moist.

Sate Ayam, grilled chicken with peanut sauce, was a tasty combination of sweet and spicy. The accompanying cucumber pickle was exotic and just the right crunchy contrast to the tender chicken.
