Harrison West Society 30th Anniversary There will be several celebrations of the anniversary, plus yearlong observance and commemoration.

**TIF Money** This year should see the first TIF money flowing into the Harrison West Society treasury. After paying for building the Harrison Park, about \$600,000 should be left over to use in Harrison West.

Harrison Park Place Harrison Park Place will continue to build, continuing the property value increase for the southern portion of Harrison West. Not only will we start welcoming our new neighbors into new homes, we will also welcome a new riverfront park into our neighborhood and the Harrison West Society will have a new building and meeting room to call our own in the parkside Community House. It doesn't get much more exciting than this!

Gateway Features on Third and Fifth This year our gateway features and traffic calming features at Third Ave. and Fifth Ave. will be built. The Society has been working on this project since 1999. The gateway feature on Third is the result of the neighborhood's UIRF application from 2001 and will make this area even more beautiful and inviting.

Harrison West Neighborhood Plan 2006 will see the Neighborhood Plan being used for shaping and guiding development throughout our neighborhood.

New Parkland This year begins the real planning for acquisition of new parkland in Harrison West, paid for in part with the \$1 million we will receive from our share of Gowdy Field.

As you can see, 2006 is going to be a huge year for Harrison West. Please join the Society or renew your membership. Also, please get involved by coming to our monthly meetings.



### Back Then

- 1865 most of Harrison West is a racetrack
- 1985 bulldozers are regular sights in HW as house after historic house is razed for "urban renewal" and the corner of Third and Michigan is one of the most violent areas in Columbus
- 1995 Battelle proposes plans to build a 9,500 gallon toxic waste site in Harrison West (it later scraps the plans)
- 1995 ODOT nixes idea of "Cap" over new 10-lane I-670 running under High Street
- 1995 City proposes 90-foot-high electrical poles and high-tension wires on Michigan
- 1996 Well-known artist, Felix de la Concha, sets up his easel in Harrison West, immortalizing the streets and buildings in a series of minutely-detailed oils, many of which later are purchased for display by the Columbus Museum of Art
- 1997 Moretti's Poultry, a poultry processing plant on Oregon south of Third, unloads semi trucks in the streets, causing streams of bloody water to run down the gutters and an incredibly foul smell to rise from the dumpsters
  - 1998 Regular street sweeping begins in HW
- 1999 planning begins to replace the festering Michigan Market at Third and Michigan with something a little more salubrious



At 3rd and Michigan, Cafe
Apropos is holding its own as an
upscale coffee and wine shop. This
is a true coffee shop that roasts and
grinds its own beans.

You can get a panini sandwich or soup, a variety of espresso and coffees, and really good ice cream. Unless you have a giant appetite, go for the half sandwich. Desserts include the Mackinaw Island ice creams, cakes and sometimes cookies or little fruit tarts.

Because the place is wireless, often there's a laptop on nearly every table.

The wine selections are extensive, but Cafe Apropos does not yet have an on-premise permit. However, every Friday from 8 to 10, at the wine tastings, \$8 will buy you the opportunity to sample 4 or 5 different wines.

Over in Thurber Center, Spinelli's Deli does great business for breakfast, lunch and catering.

Breakfast is one of their busiest meals, and when the owners are there, you can get some wisecracks with your bagel or breakfast wrap.

If the soups began life in a freezer case, it was a top-shelf freezer. The chili is very good, and hits the spot these winter days. I personally like the Italian Wedding soup, too.

Since I like things spicy, I'm partial to the Jalapeño Joe, which is turkey, Jalapeño bacon, pepperjack cheese, lettuce, tomato and Chipotle mayo -- usually in a wrap. I also like the Buffalo Bill -- chicken breast, spicy Buffalo sauce, blue cheese dressing and lettuce on focaccia.

If you're eating right, you'll find a variety of salads, including the Asian sesame chicken salad with mandarin oranges, my personal favorite.

Get out of the house and eat in Harrison West.



# Eadie Gourmet Eats Out at Cafe Corner, Spinelli's Deli, and Cafe Apropos

Sometimes you just want a sandwich or some soup within walking distance. When that happens in Harrison West, you can head to one of our three local eateries: Cafe Corner, Cafe Apropos and Spinelli's Deli. We're lucky to have them; in the 'burbs you have to get in the car and drive to find good food.

After a start as a coffee shop, Cafe Corner at 3rd and Pennsylvania now concentrates on the food. It does a decent job, too. If owner Pete Andronis is there, you'll probably get a real groaner of a joke to go with your meal.

Recently, I had an opportunity to sample Pete's homemade chicken soup. It was a tasty mix of rich broth, cooked-from-scratch chicken, noodles, onion and celery seasoned with just the right amount of pepper.

The lunch special included the soup, a BLT, pickle, pretzels, and can of cola for \$7.95.

Pete's hummus and pita is excellent, as is the tzatziki. You can get Greek gyros, homemade tuna or chicken salad, burgers, and breakfast.

When Pete's innumerable cousins are cooking and baking, you can find decadent baklava and other Greek desserts.

Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Cafe Corner is open until 3 AM.


