Harrison West Gets Credit for Gowdy Field Development

At a construction progress report for Gowdy Field, the revitalization of a former landfill into the future regional headquarters for Time Warner Cable, everyone from Mayor Coleman to Council President Matt Habash to Mike Duffey from Urban Growth was praising Harrison West for being so cooperative and giving up our rights to the space.

Time Warner is talking about bringing about 300 workers and adding about 200 more when they move.

The building exterior should be finished by December. (Eric Wagenbrenner says it will take longer to wire the 10,000 sq. ft. control room than the entire rest of the building.)

This building is the Southern anchor for the Technology Corridor, and it is only the first of many new builds coming to our area.



Sign on the Line for Harrison West TIF

It's time to <u>Sign on the Line</u> for the Harrison West Neighborhood TIF. The TIF (Tax Increment Financing) will be returning the increases in our property taxes to the neighborhood for the next 30 years.

No, the TIF does not increase your taxes -- the County Auditor does that as the value of your property increases. The TIF doesn't affect this assessment.

No, the TIF does not take away from the schools - the Columbus Public Schools get their share of the increased tax revenue right off the top.

Yes, the TIF keeps only the increase in our property taxes here in the neighborhood for us to spend on capital improvements.

Yes, Harrison West deserves a TIF. It's been ignored and mistreated for so long, it's about time all the property owners started seeing something coming back to the neighborhood, don't you think?

Yes, you DO need to <u>Sign on the Line</u> when a neighbor shows up with the paperwork. Otherwise, the City will take 15% off the top to administer the TIF for your property -- just for your property! Why send that money to the City when it could be staying in Harrison West making much-needed capital improvements?

Gil and Becky Borlaza, Mary Funk, Sandy Woolard, and Chris Ruder are the current <u>Sign on the Line</u> Committee members. If you want to help bring all the TIF to Harrison West, step up at the October 18 meeting.

Just think of the Harrison West Neighborhood TIF as a gift you have to sign for.

TIF Facts:

- The Harrison West Neighborhood TIF was put into place in April, 2004, on a basis of 777 properties
- The first proceeds will be coming to the neighborhood in December, 2006
- Only the increased tax revenue generated because Harrison West is prospering will come back to Harrison West for *capital* improvements, after the Schools get their full share
- The first TIF monies will be used to buy land and to develop Harrison Park
 - Only property owners need <u>Sign on the Line</u>
- For neighborhood property owners, there is *no downside to the TIF*

HARRISON WEST SOCIETY MINUTES September 20, 2006

The regular monthly meeting of the Harrison West Society was held on Wednesday, September 20, 2006, at 7:00 PM. in the First Brethren Church, 473 West Third Avenue. President Rob Harris, Vice President Mary Funk, Treasurer Becky Borlaza and Secretary Barbara Kobee were present. A quorum of more then eight was reached.

The minutes of the previous (August 16, 2006) meeting were approved. (The Motion was made by Jim Slone and seconded by Rick Kobee).

Treasurer Borlaza presented the Treasurer's Report. The current balance in the check book: \$9,991.94.

Borlaza worked with Scott Robinson, Budget and Finance committee chair, on the following recommendations:

- Savings Account \$2,500 is the opening balance. Treasurer will propose at Society's monthly meeting an amount to transfer to the savings account. Usually between \$250 \$500 depending on cash flow.
- Certificates of Deposit \$2,500 11-month, 5.30% APY, CD. Treasurer will propose to open CD's throughout the year depending on rates and cash flow.

Borlaza made a Motion to open a savings account with an opening balance of \$2,500. Also \$2,500 for an eleven month 5.30% APY, Certificate of Deposit. (Pastor Morris Seconded the Motion). The Motion was approved.

Borlaza listed a Traffic Island maintenance quote; Urban Gardener: \$4,500/year.

According to President Harris, the Victorian Village Tour of Homes was very successful. There were three properties from Harrison West on the Tour. There were 1,500 pre-sold tickets. Victorian Village and Harrison West worked well together.

Possible Harrison West Holiday Tour? The Society needs to check for possible date conflicts with other Holiday Neighborhood Tours.

Victorian Village Secretary said that a coordinated garage and yard sale with Harrison West would be the first Saturday in June, 2007. She wants a reminder around April 1.

Scott Robinson, Budget and Finance committee chair, would like to work on fund raising and get together with committee chairs to initiate the budget process.

Gil Borlaza, Communications member, has been discussing the residents' discount card program with Kevin Wood. He is researching the pitfalls and the proper marketing techniques and exploring the various yenders.

Pastor Morris, Civic/Conservation committee chair, attended the Counsel of Historic Neighborhoods and said that they plan to update the language and photographs associated with Harrison West section in their brochure. Pastor Morris said that he would like Harrison West to be one of the sponsors of the brochure.

City Council plans to establish the process to proceed with the neighborhood conservation districts

Pastor Morris made a Motion to designate \$150.00 for sponsorship of Historic Neighborhood brochure. (Seconded by Scott Robinson and Tom Maxwell). The Motion was approved.

Chris Ruder, Constitution and By-Laws committee chair, would like to have a draft of the proposed revised By-Laws ready by January or February. This way the new officers would have time to adjust to the revised By-Laws. He would like to incorporate the Harrison West boundaries into the By-Laws.

Bob Mangia, Parks committee chair, is continuing to receiving Traffic Island maintenance quotes. He reported that the city will begin tree trimming on Third Avenue.

Jacob Sukosd, Planning and Development committee chair, reported that six or seven homes sold in Harrison Park, pushing the transactions in Harrison West to 13 or 14. The average now is approximately \$300,000 per home as a result.

400 West First Avenue— Property owner is requesting variances for the proposed house on the property. The property owner is eager to work with the Harrison West Society on this project.

Tim Bledsoe, Social committee chair, reported that there were no dates available at Alpha State, according to Lori Moffet. Thus unfortunately, the Harrison West Society will not have a harvest party.

Officer Steve Smith, Crime Report:

- Three burglaries; two were unlocked, one felony theft (kayak recovered in the woods), one theft (scam with elderly homeowner/knocking on the door),
- Four miscellaneous thefts: lawn mower, purse, bike, rock thrown through window.

Mark Wagenbrenner and an attorney from Squire Sanders & Dempsey spoke about the Harrison West TIF and the need for property owners' signatures. They suggested that perhaps there might be a need for a committee to be established. They explained why it is important to gather all the property owners signatures.

Mary Funk, Vice President, volunteered to head the committee with Sandy Woolard and possibly Deb Heinman. They will provide all information on the TIF as well as how to become involved in obtaining signatures.



Harrison Park **Update**

Developer Mark Wagenbrenner tells the *News* that all the public infrastructure should be finished by November, with the exception of street trees and sidewalks. These will be done as homes and buildings are finished to avoid damaging them during construction. They are finishing pavement and curbs on Quality Place and Ingleside in the next few weeks. Street trees on the east side of Perry should go in this fall, though the Perry Street island landscaping will be installed next Spring.

Houses They have completed 21 homes and framed out 7 more. Seven spec homes are immediately available; the rest are sold and 10 of the

homes are occupied, including Bonnie and Nick Kentris' home which was on the Vic Vil Tour of Homes.

Flats They have begun framing the first of three of the Flats of Harrison Park at the southeast corner of Perry and West First Avenue. They plan on completing all of the 42 units in this building in May or June. Prices in this building range from \$159,000 to \$240,000 with floor plans ranging from 840 sq. ft. to 1,270 sq. ft.

The Community Center It's framed and under roof, to be finished by mid April. The Harrison West Society will be using the facility for meetings perhaps as early as May.

The Park Wagenbrenner is working diligently with the Harrison West Society to get the signatures (see Sign on the Line on Page 1) to keep the majority of the TIF proceeds in the neighborhood. Once we get the signatures, Wagenbrenner intends to secure bond funds so as to begin construction by next summer. The

Park Committee will begin meeting in the first quarter again to begin final planning on the park.

Gowdy Field You can't have missed the progress on Time Warner's Regional Headquarters. More than 120,000 yards of fill has been trucked in, and the steel frame is getting exterior sheathing now. It's currently on schedule for a July, 07 delivery. The building should be under roof and sealed up by December 15th.

They're designing the second building and will break ground late next year. Site work will continue through the winter and spring of 2007. Olentangy River Road will be widened late this year or early next year, so get ready for traffic delays. Wagenbrenner reports that they will be doing everything possible to minimize delays.

Wednesday's Special sandwich is Grandma Merkle's beef brisket with spicy mustard on a soft roll. Yum!

Did I mention the Brown Bag wraps? I never pass up the Reuben Wrap. It's grilled; it's gooey; it's a terrific combination of soft, spicy, meaty, healthy, tasty.

They make lots of salads -both green and meaty kinds. The Greek chicken is a perennial favorite, but I also like the gorgonzola, pinenut, and cranberry with Balsamic chicken.

Prices are great. The Village Addiction sandwich is only \$6.50

(if I can avoid dessert). Salads start at \$1.75.

Desserts are incredible. If you're there when Molly has baked a lemon pound cake or raspberry chocolate cake, don't miss it. The brownies are bigger than your hand and full of nuts and chips. So are the cookies.

They're expanding to allow for more tables and a bigger kitchen, both of which are needed.

There's also a good wine and beer selection, and they do lots of catering. Open Monday through Saturday 9 - 8 PM; closed Sunday. 443-4214.

Eadie Gourmet Eats Out at Brown Bag Deli

Since my office is in German Village, I lunch at the Brown Bag Deli, corner of Mohawk and Whittier, frequently. Let me tell you, much as I like the restaurants in Harrison West, they all could take lessons from BBD owner Molly Pesich. She is a genius with soups, sandwiches and desserts!

The soups — different every day, always homemade on site, and always just a touch unexpected. I'm nuts for her spicy carrot, curry chicken noodle, tomato with sweet pepper and basil, puree of roasted vegetable. Last week I had a divine butternut squash and garlic, and I don't care for squash! You get the idea.

The sandwiches are equally good. I love the Tuesday special, which is Tuscan Tuna, made with tuna, olive oil, lemon juice, garbanzo beans, Roma tomatoes, and cilantro. It's piled high on toasted ciabatta bread. So simple, but it spoils you for any other tuna salad. I'm torturing myself here, folks.

There's a sandwich board listing about 12 sandwiches they can make any time. Number 7 is the Village Addiction. Thin-sliced smoked turkey, cranberry mayo, Havarti, grilled on sourdough --perfection.

If you want something different, ask for a Kim-wich. Kim Abraham will whip you up something slightly odd -- with dill pickles. Always with the pickles.
