
The Wheeler Park steering committee, directed by Mark Young of Recreation & Parks, has completed the final recommendation and endorsed a design ready for bidding and construction.

The details of the park will have the existing lights replaced to match the historic style acorn lights, the

benches will be of the quality of the Side by Side Park, new tables & litter receptacles, and a pump style water feature.

A unique feature to the park will be a fence design that has small spaced pickets for puppies & small dogs, wider spaced mid section for mid-size dogs, and a wider spacing for our human scale.

The fence design will add visual interest, while providing safety for our canine friends. We look forward to the park starting construction this summer with an early fall completion.

Our Harrison West neighborhood signs are in need of attention, the crackle glazing of the Third Avenue sign and the glaring orange of the Harrison Avenue sign are rather sad and do not speak of the quality of our neighborhood.

Harrison West has invited our fellow neighbors in Italian Village and Victorian Village, under the direction of the Short North Foundation, to study ways to improve our neighborhood identity through unified signs.

The initial proposal is to have a common theme of using the Short North arches as a unifying symbol that bridges our neighborhoods into a common thread. The initial font rec-

ommendation is Goudy Old Style recommended based on it's historic usage at the time our neighborhoods were being built.

The suggested material is having the signs cast similar to historical markers to give an air of dignity and permanence.

The combined effort of our neighborhoods will allow us to simplify the allocation of funds, permitting, manufacturing, and implementation, thus allowing a layering of our many talented Short North residents.

- use cloth napkins instead of paper?
- save plain junk mail for scrap paper?
- use kitchen scraps, shred paper, save leaves, for compost?

• join with others to help rescue the planet? How?

Make Your Own Cleaning Products from Natural Products

In addition to being non-toxic, making

your own cleaning products from things you already have at home saves the costs of production, transporting, and packaging--which is good for your health and for the planet's health.

Some examples:

All-purpose Spray Cleaner: Combine in a spray bottle 1/2 tsp washing soda, 1/2 tsp Borax, 1/2 tsp vegetable oil-based soap, 2 Tbsp vinegar and 2 cups of hot water. Shake well until all the solid bits have dissolved. For extra cleaning power increase Borax to 1 tsp. Then spray and wipe clean with a damp cloth or sponge.

Natural surface cleaner: Mix about 1/2 cup baking soda and enough liquid dish soap until the consistency is like frosting. Apply mixture to a sponge as an ideal cleaner for any sink.

A Martha Stewart special (known by many): Dip half a lemon in baking soda for a great sink cleaner - no sponge necessary..

Are you a scourer? For greasy dirt usually encountered in the kitchen and on the walls, wash surfaces with a small amount of *washing soda* (not baking soda) in water. Use rubber gloves when putting hands directly into a washing soda solution since it's very strong and can irritate the skin. Or make your own scouring powder by combining 1 cup of baking soda and 1/4 cup of washing soda.

Kill mold! Use full-strength vinegar. To keep mold under control spray with diluted vinegar on a regular basis. Vinegar can get rid of those pesky ants, too.

About 871,000 tons of trash were dumped last year at the landfill, south of Columbus off I-71 in Jackson Township. About 348,000 tons came from households.

Musty Smells: Combine 1 tsp of tea tree oil and 1 cup of water in a spritzer bottle. Spray the area, but don't wipe it off. In a couple of days the smell should be gone and the tea tree oil should have dissipated. If not, repeat..

Moisture Problems: Mold and mildew thrive in moist, warm areas. Kitty litter helps to absorb the moisture, so place out bowls of kitty litter and replace once a week until the problem is gone.

Window Cleaner: Use club soda and a cotton cloth.




